Become an Academic Mentor

The National Tutoring Programme is funded by the Department for Education to support schools and pupils across England. The programme places Academic Mentors in schools to provide one-to-one and small group, subject-specific tuition for disadvantaged pupils, or those whose education has been impacted by the pandemic.

As a vital member of the school team, you'll be working alongside teachers to provide 15-hour blocks of tuition for pupils who need it most. As an Academic Mentor, you'll be supporting, guiding, and inspiring young people at a crucial time in their development. Academic Mentors can tutor pupils in primary school literacy, numeracy or science, or secondary school English, humanities, maths, modern foreign languages, or science. You may also be able to offer tutoring in more than one subject, depending on your expertise and the requirements of your school.

This is a great opportunity to get school experience in a primary or secondary setting, which is invaluable for those who are considering a career in teaching.

You don't need to have experience of working in education to become an Academic Mentor as our fully funded training will ensure that you have all the knowledge you need for your new role. As long as you have enthusiasm and a passion for making a difference to the lives of young people, we'll cover the rest.

To become an Academic Mentor, you'll need:

- Minimum of three A-levels at A* - C grade (or equivalent)
- Minimum of Grade 4 (grade C equivalent) in English and maths at GCSE level

Your responsibilities will include:

- Working with the school's Senior Leadership Team to identify the support each pupil needs
- Identifying learning gaps and helping create bespoke intervention programmes for pupils
- Developing and delivering engaging sessions with clear learning objectives, considering any barriers to learning or additional needs
- Delivering measurable outcomes from each session to track progress
